

t. Francis of Assisi (1181/2–1226) is one of the most loved saints in the Roman Catholic Church because he embodied the Gospel in a simple, joyful, and radical way. Born into wealth, he renounced possessions to live in poverty, mirroring Christ's own life. This humility and detachment from material goods stood in sharp contrast to the wealth of the Church in his day, making him a prophetic witness of authenticity and simplicity.

Francis' spirituality was centred on following Christ as closely as possible. His radical poverty was not about deprivation but about freedom to rely completely on God. His union with Christ was so profound that he became the first saint to receive the stigmata, the wounds of lesus, seen as a mystical sign of deep identification with the Crucified Lord.

Another reason for his lasting appeal is his deep love for creation. Francis saw all creatures as reflections of God's beauty, calling them "brother" and "sister." His Canticle of the Creatures praises God through the sun, moon, animals, and even death. This vision makes him the patron saint of ecology and animals, and a model for today's ecological spirituality, notably reflected in Pope Francis' encyclical Laudato Si'.

Francis was also a man of joy and peace. His greeting "Pax et bonum" (peace and good) expressed his spirit of reconciliation. He reached out to the poor, embraced lepers, and even met with the Sultan during the Crusades, showing openness to dialogue across religious lines.

Popular devotion to Francis remains strong because of his closeness to ordinary people. He began the tradition of the **Christmas crib**, helping the faithful visualise Christ's humble birth. In short, Catholics love St. Francis because he reflected Christ with such humility, simplicity, and joy that he became

a living Gospel for every generation.
